Course requirements

Summary

You will be participating in your Alaska Close Up session with the other students in the program, and will also participate in career exploration classes and work experience. You will complete advance assignments, and all lessons assigned during the session. You will write a short journal and evaluation, to be completed within two weeks of the end of the session.

- 1 Complete the Government Intern advance assignments. (Web site: www.serrc.org/academy)
- 2 Attend and participate in selected student activities for the Alaska Close Up session.
- 3 Complete the activities on the Government Intern assignment sheet and return it with your instructor's signature.
- 4 Complete a journal/evaluation of the Government Intern session, and mail or FAX it to the instructor within two weeks of the end of your session.

Journal contents:

- a) Describe the effectiveness of the Alaska Close Up web site and advance assignments in preparing you for your Alaska Close Up experience.
- b) For each day, Sunday through Friday, write two or three paragraphs that discuss one or more of the following items.
 - Major concepts you learned about state government
 - The learning activities that taught you the most about government and careers in government.
 - General evaluation of the positive and negative aspects of the day.
 - Characteristics of good employees.
 - The value of your work experience in preparing you for employment and careers.
- c) Discuss how your overall Government Intern experience has influenced your perception of state government, and your career aspirations.
