Summer Camp is just the start to great summer learning opportunities. Check out the great activities waiting for you just around the corner.

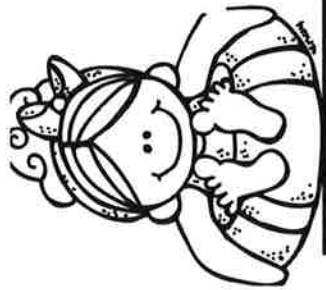

Just 20 minutes a day will help to prevent summer learning slide. Reading builds vocabulary, encourages imagination and curiosity while helping students perform better in school.

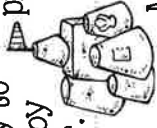
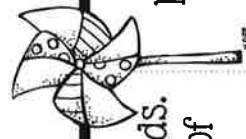
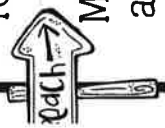


Summertime Fun Time Activity Calendar

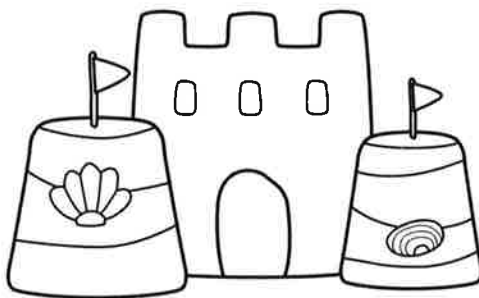
